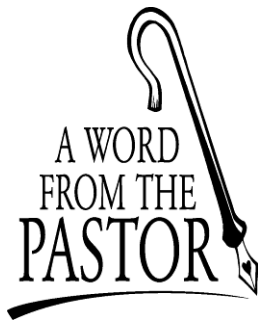

If there is a biblical text that you know of that isn't listed here but speaks to what you've been asked to do, then have that text ready to discuss. We have several weeks as we're aiming for a congregation wide event on June 6<sup>th</sup>. We know graduations are that weekend-but are there ceremonies happening at 11AM? Not likely. So read away and show up ready to help discern God's direction for Northminster. Enjoy the reading-the Bible is our unique and authoritative witness to the relationship of God with humanity.

 A time for the Planning Team to share some of the results of their work as they prepare to go to the next level of planning for Northminster's future.

## **Session Highlights**

The Session met in regular stated meeting April 20 in the Family Room. Rev. McCormick opened the meeting with prayer at 7:08 PM.

The Pastor led the Session in exploring various stories/parables from the Bible, searching for stories that might describe Northminster's past, present, or future.

The Session received reports from the Pastor and most of the committees of Session.

The Pastor reported that he will be gone April 21-22 to attend a Board of Pensions workshop as the Committee on Ministry representative. He officiated at the funeral of Kathryn Lucille Emmons (died March 19, 2010) at the Littleton & Rue Funeral Home. Interment was in Glen Haven Memorial Gardens.

Session unanimously approved a motion from the Planning Committee to host a catered dinner for the congregation after worship on June 6, 2010. At the dinner the Planning Committee will share some of what they have learned during their conversations with the various groups within the congregation. There will also be opportunity for congregation members to engage in discussion/conversation.

Elder Jim Twiggs reported for the Finance Committee that total income for January 1 through March 12 was \$46,665 and total expenses were \$54,471, producing a deficit of \$7,806.

The next stated meeting of Session is May 25, 2010 at 7:00 PM, with committees meeting at 6:00 PM.

Please continue to pray for the Pastor and Session as we try to serve this congregation and our Lord Jesus Christ.

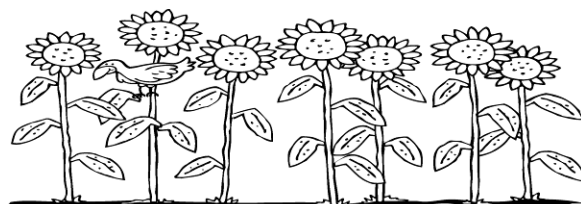

**WEATHER CONDITIONS AS RELATED TO SEASONAL ALLERGIES**

Local weather conditions are an aid to seasonal allergies. Conditions such as wind direction and speed, relative humidity, temperature, and ground dryness or even wetness can lead to conditions that may lead to allergy suffering. If the ground is dry or wet, the wind speed or air motion can pick up ground dust and dirt that may be inhaled and cause uncomfortable eye and nasal conditions. The relative humidity is a factor as to the ability of the air to hold the dust or dirt particles. The more moist the air, the greater the ability the air has to hold them.

The temperature is also a determining factor. The warmer the air, the more the atmosphere can hold the particles. These conditions are more emphasized in the late summer and autumn because of the dryness and warmth of the air. Keeping track of these conditions is simple. Taking daily readings of temperature and precipitation can keep one abreast of the changes in the weather and let you know if there will be a chance condition leading to allergy problems.

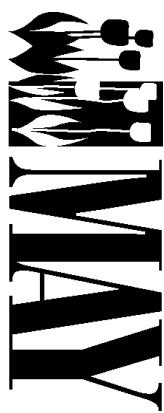
